CONIVGATIO PRIMA (first conjugation “ā-stem”)

accūsat [accūsō, accūsāre], *accuses*

cantat [cantō, cantāre], *sings*

imperat [imperō, imperāre], *orders*

interrogat [interrogō, interrogāre], *asks*

numerat [numerat, numerāre], *counts*

plōrat [plōrō, plōrāre], *weeps*

pulsat [pulsō, pulsāre], *punches, strikes*

salūtat [salūtō, salūtāre], *greets*

verberat [verberō, verberāre], *beats*

vocat [vocō, vocāre], *calls*

CONIVGATIO SECVUNDA (second conjugation “ē-stem”)

habet [habeō habēre], *has*

pāret [pāreō, pārēre], *obeys*

respondet [respondeō, respondēre], *answers*

rīdet [rīdeō, rīdēre], *smiles, laughs*

tacet [taceō, tacēre], *is silent*

videt [videō, vidēre], *sees*

CONIVGATIO TERTII (third conjugation "consonant-stem")

discēdit [discēdō, discēdere], *goes away, leaves*

pōnit [pōnō, pōnere], *places*

sūmit [sūmō, sūmere], *takes up*

CONIVGATIO QVARTA (fourth conjugation “ī-stem”)

audit [audiō, audīre], *hears*

dormit [dormiō, dormīre], *sleeps*

venit [veniō, venīre], *comes*
