

Glossary

Many of the definitions of ME plant names and all Latin botanical names are based on those suggested by Hunt, *Plant Names of Medieval England*.

References are representative rather than exhaustive; all references for any sense or form appearing in D are given first, then all in C. An asterisk before a form or a line reference indicates an emendation. Entries are arranged alphabetically: *y* when used to represent a vowel is treated as vocalic *i*; *i* when used to represent a consonant is treated as *j*; *þ* (thorn) is treated as *th*; *v* when used to represent a vowel is treated as vocalic *u*; *ȝ* (yogh) when used to represent a consonant is treated as *y*; medially as *-gh-*, and occasionally in final position as *z*.
